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Battery Back-Up Operation

This clock radio is equipped with a memory holding system that can be powered with 2 "AA" batteries (included). The power failure protection circuit will not operate unless battery is installed.

When normal household power is interrupted, or the AC line cord is unplugged, the batteries will power the clock radio to keep track of time and alarm settings programmed into memory. When the battery backup functions, the digital display will not light, however, the function of alarm still occurs during the power interruption if the remaining battery power is adequate. Normal operation will resume after AC power is restored so you will not have to reset the time or the alarm.


Install batteries as follow:

- Unlock the battery compartment door (located at the bottom of the radio) by sliding the tab away from the door.
- 2. Remove the battery compartment door.
- 3. Insert 2 "AA" batteries.
- Replace the compartment door and slide the tab to lock battery compartment.

Power Failure Indicator

When the AC power is interrupted (disconnected) for a short period of time, both time and alarm settings will change (unless optional battery is installed). After the AC power is restored (reconnected), the Digital Display will blink to indicate that power was interrupted and you should readjust the time and alarm settings.





Before You Begin

Automatic Time Set

You do not have to set the clock time as a built-in automatic time set system is equipped in this clock powered by 2 X AA batteries (included). All you have to do is to plug this clock for power and current time will be shown automatically.

Daylight Saving

You can press and hold **DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME** ———— at the bottom of the unit to turn on / off the Daylight Saving function in areas observing / not observing such time change.

Setting Time Zone

Before plugging in for power, follow the steps below to select time zone.

You may slide the time zone selector at the bottom of the clock to Eastern (1), Central (2), mountain (3) or Pacific (4).





Setting the Clock

This unit has a built-in automatic time set system that automatically generates the correct clock time once the unit is plugged in. You are not required to set the clock manually, however, in case the memory holding batteries are accidentally removed, you may set the clock manually with following procedures:



Note:

The clock is in 12 hour format. The AM and PM indicators will light to show am and pm time

respectively.

Setting Clock

- Be sure Time Zone and Daylight Saving Time is adjusted before operating the clock.
- Press SET CLOCK/WAKE repeatedly until the clock setting icon is displayed.
- Press REV or FWD to set the time. Press and hold the respective buttons to fast reverse or fast forward clock time.
- Clock time will automatically be saved if no buttons are pressed after a few seconds. You can also press SET CLOCK/WAKE once to save your setting and return to standby mode.

Operating the Wake Timer

Setting the Wake Time

- Press SET CLOCK/WAKE repeatedly until WAKE 1 or WAKE 2 icon shows on the display.
- Press REV or FWD to set the wake time. The time decrements or increments will follow by a faster rate when you press and hold either REV or FWD.
- Press SET CLOCK/WAKE repeatedly to exit setting wake time mode. Or else the unit will exit setting wake time mode when no button is pressed within 5 seconds



Note:

The unit equips with **GRAD-U-WAKE** feature, the alarm tone volume will

increase gradually to its maximum in about 30 to 45 seconds.

Selecting Wake Mode

To change to another wake mode (e.g. from CD to radio), simply press **WAKE 1** or **WAKE 2** repeatedly to scroll through wake options. ��— □□—⑤

When the AC power is disconnected, the unit will enter DC backup mode, all wake mode will be

reverted to alarm tone.

Waking to CD

When the waking to CD is selected, ① / ② icon will light.

- 1. Press [>[]] to turn on the CD.
- 2. Set the wake time.
- Press WAKE 1 or WAKE 2 to select waking up by CD, (1) / (2) will light accordingly.
- Press VOLUME + / to adjust to your desired wake up volume.
- 5. Press **OFF** to stop the CD playback.

You can select your CD wake up track by the following procedures.

- In CD mode, while pressing WAKE UP CD TRACK / STATION, press REV or FWD to select your desired CD wake up track.
- Release WAKE UP CD TRACK / STA-TION, and the CD wake up track is set.
- To reset the CD wake up track, follow the above procedures and set the CD wake up track to 1.

If the CD compartment is empty, the alarm tone will sound instead even the WAKE TO CD mode is

selected.

Turning off Alarm

Press **SNOOZE**. The alarm will sound again when the snooze period is over. (see "**Snooze**" section).

2. Stop the alarm

Press **OFF** and the alarm will be on again the following day at the same time.

- 3. Disable the alarm permanently
- Press CANCEL.

Operating the Radio

Using the Weather Band

Weather information is given continuously from U.S. Government Weather Stations on frequencies from 162 4MHz to 162 55MHz

The Weather transmission, broadcast 24 hours a day, are taped messages that are repeated every 4 to 6 minutes and revised and updated as needed to match the changing weather conditions. For additional information, check your location office of the National Weather Service (Department of Commerce).

- Press INSTANT WEATHER to access Weather Bands with strong signals to the unit.
- 2. Press **REV** or **FWD** to select among the 7 weather channels.
- Wx will light and the channel number will show on the display.

Antennas

FM antenna - The power cord acts as your FM antenna. It picks up moderate to strong radio stations and eliminates the need for an external antenna in most strong signal areas. Be sure the power cord is stretched to its full length. Do not coil or bunch the cord together. Changing position of the power cord may improve reception.

AM Antenna - A built-in ferrite rod antenna eliminates the need for an outside antenna for AM reception. Rotating the unit slightly may improve reception of distant AM stations.

Tuning the Stations

- Press RADIO ON/BAND (located on the front of the radio) to turn on the radio.
- Press RADIO ON/BAND repeatedly to select the desired broadcast band.
- Press REV or FWD to tune to your desired radio station.
- Press VOLUME + / to adjust to your desired listening level.



Tip:

"UP" will show briefly on the display when you press **VOLUME+**.

When you press and hold **VOLUME+** until the maximum volume is reached, "UP" will flash on the display.

"dn" will show briefly on the display when you press VOLUME-. When you press and hold VOLUME- until the minimum volume is reached, "dn" will flash on the display.



Operating the Radio

Setting the Preset Radio Stations

- Press RADIO ON/BAND to turn on the radio
- Press RADIO ON/BAND to change the broadcast band.
- Press **REV** or **FWD** to tune to your desired radio station.
- 4. If you want to memorize this radio station, press MEMO/SET once, and then press RECALL repeatedly to choose the radio station number you want to record in.
- 5. Press **MEMO/SET** again to confirm.
- If you set the radio station in the AL location, it will be the wake up radio station of the alarm.



Note:

This unit can store up to 11 preset radio stations, while **AL** location is for the wake up radio station.

Automatic Radio Station Search

- Press RADIO ON/BAND (located on the front of the radio) to turn on the radio.
- Press and hold **REV** or **FWD** for 2 seconds, it will automatically search a radio station for you.



Overwriting the Preset Radio Stations

- Press RADIO ON/BAND to turn on the radio.
- 2. Press **REV** or **FWD** to tune to your desired preset radio station.
- Press MEMO/SET once and then press RECALL repeatedly to choose the radio station number you want to overwrite
- 4. Press MEMO/SET again to confirm.

Deleting the Preset Radio Stations

- Press RECALL repeatedly to select your preset radio station you want to delete.
- Press and hold MEMO/SET for 3 seconds to delete the selected preset radio station.



Listening to Compact Disc

- Press OPEN/CLOSE to open the CD compartment.
- 2. Insert a disc, press **OPEN/CLOSE** to close the CD compartment door.

Alarm Settings

Setting Sleep Time

In sleep mode, the radio and CD will turn off automatically. To set the sleep time, simply:

- Press SLEEP, then the time display will exhibit 0:59 and the radio will turn on (default). While holding SLEEP, press REV or FWD to set the sleep time. The time range is from 1 minute to 2 hours (default is 0:59).
- Release **SLEEP** and the current time will be shown again, sill show on the display, and the sleep time is set.

Sleep to Radio

- Under sleep mode, press RADIO ON / BAND to turn on the radio.
- Sleep radio station will automatically switch to the current radio station, you may select the radio station as usual.
- 3. Once the sleep time is reached, the radio will turn off automatically.

You can reset to sleep to a different radio station, simply:

- 1. Press RADIO ON/BAND.
- Press REV or FWD to tune to the radio station you want to sleep to.



Tip:

The unit will enter either CD or Radio mode after **SLEEP** is

pressed, depending on the previous sleep setting.

Sleep to CD

- Under sleep mode, press ▷ [] to start CD playback.
- CD play mode will be automatically in Repeat All mode when using Sleep to CD setting.
- 3. The unit will turn off automatically once the sleep time is reached.

Viewing Remaining Time

Press **SLEEP** to read the remaining sleep time.



Tip:

If you decide to turn off the unit sooner, press **SNOOZE** or **OFF**

When the sleep mode is activated again, the sleep time will be the same as the one you have set before.

Nap Mode

For catnaps up to 2 hours without disturbing the regular alarm settings, the NAP function wakes you up after a short period of time. Simply:

- Press NAP, the NAP indicator will flash. While the NAP indicator is flashing, press REV or FWD to adjust nap time. The time range is from 10 minutes to 2 hours at 10 minutes interval (default is 20 minutes).
- Wait 3 seconds or press NAP again to confirm, the NAP indicator will show on the display.
- Press NAP once to show time left, after 3 seconds, the display will return to clock time.

Stopping the Nap Alarm

When the NAP alarm sounds, you can press **OFF** to stop it.

Cancelling the Nap Alarm

Press and hold **NAP** for 5 seconds to cancel the nap setting.



Tip:

Only alarm tone can be selected in NAP mode.

Snooze

This operation allows extra sleep time after the alarm is on. The alarm will be off by pressing **SNOOZE** until the snooze period is over. Snooze function can be used repeatedly up to 2 hours. After this, the alarm will turn off until the next alarm conditions are met. Set the "quiet" period as follow:

 While pressing SNOOZE, press REV or FWD to set the "quiet" period (the default time is 9 minutes) from 1 minute to 30 minutes. Release SNOOZE, then the "quiet" period is set.

Auto Brightness

Slide the AUTO BRIGHTNESS switch

"CON position. The brightness of the LCD display will vary automatically according to the environment.

Slide to the **OFF** position, the display will remain at its brightest level.

Backlight Color Select

You can choose among 4 different backlight color - green, blue, amber and white.

- 1. Before a specific color is set, the backlight color will keep changing.
- Press Color Select Color Select at the back of the unit to toggle among different backlight color.
- If the AC power and backup batteries are removed, the 4 backlight colors will starting changing again once the AC power is resumed.

Care and Maintenance

Handling Compact Discs

- Do not touch the signal surfaces. Hold by the edges, or by one edge and the hole.
- Do not affix labels or adhesive tape to the label surfaces. Also, do not scratch or damage the label.
- Discs rotate at high speeds inside the player. Do not use damaged (cracked or warped) discs.

Cleaning Compact Discs

- Dirty discs can cause poor sound quality. Always keep discs clean by wiping them gently with a soft cloth from the inner edge toward the outer perimeter.
- If a disc becomes dirty, wet a soft cloth in water, wring it out well, wipe the dirt away gently, and then remove any water drops with a dry cloth.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays or anti-static agents on discs. Also, never clean discs with benzene, thinner, or other volatile solvents which may cause damage to the disc surface.

CD Lens Care

When your CD lens gets dirty it can also cause the unit to output poor sound quality. To clean the lens you will need to purchase a CD lens cleaner which can maintain the output sound quality. For instructions on cleaning the CD lens, refer to the ones accompanying the lens care.

Cleaning the Exterior

Prior to cleaning the exterior, be sure to unplug the power cord from the AC power outlet. Wipe the exterior with a soft, clean, and slightly water-dampened cloth.

Precautions
