Before You Begin

Unpacking Your Player
You should have the following:
• one voice recorder
• one USB cable
• one user manual

Before You Begin

Using earphones and external microphone
When earphones are connected, sound output from speaker will be muted.
When external microphone is connected, no record can be made from built-in microphone.

Before You Begin

2. Press REVERSE or FORWARD to set beep sound ON/OFF.
3. Press MENU to confirm selection.

Setting the Time

With this function, you can always read on the display the recording date and time of your recorded messages. Follow the steps below for time setting.

Setting the Time

REVERSE or FORWARD to increase/decrease the number, press MENU to confirm.

Bookmark

Creating a bookmark
This feature allows you to create an interception point in the recorded message for quick reference.

Bookmark

Deleting a bookmark
1. Select folder (A/B/C/D).
2. Select file.

Recording Mode

Setting Recording Mode
You can select between two recording modes - manual recording and AVR (automatic voice recording).

Recording Mode

Setting Recording Quality
You can select between two recording qualities. Default is HQ.

Recording Mode

Setting Recording Condition
You can select between two recording conditions. Default is DICT.

Recording Mode

Tip: For conferences, to obtain optimum recording quality, place the recorder with the microphone freely exposed to the sound source as close as convenient.

Recording Mode

If power supplied from the battery fails suddenly (e.g. batteries are removed accidentally) during recording, the memory which was used for the recording will not be readable or usable.

Erasing file/folder

Erasing selected file
You can delete a file by the following steps:

Erasing file/folder

Erasing all files in a folder
You can delete all files in a specific folder by the following steps.

Advanced operation

Insert
You can insert new segments into a file without erasing previously recorded content.

Advanced operation

Append
You can add appendix (e.g. reminder, supplementary information) to the end of the file.

Advanced operation

Cut
You can erase unwanted parts from your recording.

Advanced operation

Format
(Caution! All data inside the memory will be erased)

Advanced operation

Connect to the Computer
You can format the internal memory when needed (e.g. compatibility problem, etc.)

Connecting to the Computer

Using the Digital Voice Manager
The RCA Digital Voice Manager can perform playback, organize your bookmarks of the recorded files and create self-executable voice file from the recorded files.

Connecting to the Computer

Playback and Editing Operations
1. To organize your files, click the corresponding buttons to cut, delete, copy and paste a file (or a folder) and drop.

Connecting to the Computer

Transfer Files with the Digital Voice Manager (Voice Files Only)
Your player is associated with a drive letter. You can drag the voice files you want to transfer to your player to the A/B/C/D folder in the drive.

Connecting to the Computer

Using your player as a file storage device
The player can function as a detachable data storage device. You can take along your favorite pictures and documents wherever you go.

Connecting to the Computer

Disconnecting from the Computer
After you have copied files to or from the player, you can disconnect the player from the computer.

Connecting to the Computer

Player doesn't turn on
• Check that batteries are properly inserted and not exhausted.

Connecting to the Computer

Cannot activate the player after pressing on keys
• There may be software problems. Remove the batteries to reset the player.

Connecting to the Computer

Recordable time becomes shorter
• You may have set the recording quality to 'High Quality', refer to section 'Setting Recording Quality'.

Connecting to the Computer

Display keeps flashing when player is off
• You may not have set the time. Refer to section on Time Setting.

Connecting to the Computer

Cannot record
• Make sure LOCK function is not activated.

Connecting to the Computer

Cannot erase recorded file(s)
• Make sure you follow each step under section "Erasing Selected File" carefully.
